*The East Lycoming School District is committed to safely providing in-person instruction for all students every day. The district will continue to monitor and consider, to the greatest extent practicable, information provided through the Departments of Health and Education to support COVID prevention and mitigation.*

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The East Lycoming School District will use multiple avenues of services to provide for the continuity of education, as well as needed support services for students and staff. Our Guidance Counselors, Social Worker, and Outside service providers will be used to service our students in need of additional support. The district will once again participate in the Federal Lunch program, which will offer students a free breakfast and a free lunch daily. We will continue to participate in the federal free meal program as long as it is offered. The continuity of services will continue regardless of in-person or remote learning.

a. Universal and correct wearing of <a href="#">masks</a> ;	<del>The wearing of masks is optional. Students and staff will not be required to wear a face mask during the school day in all buildings and on school grounds effective November 10, 2021, based on the Commonwealth Court's Order in <u>Corman et al. v Beam</u> and it granting the motion to terminate the automatic stay. The district will support all staff members and students that opt to wear a mask.</del>
b. Modifying facilities to allow for <a href="#">physical distancing</a> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	The district will continue to maintain social distancing and use cohort groups to the maximum extent feasible.
c. <a href="#">Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</a> ;	The East Lycoming School District will continue to educate our staff and students on hygiene practices and the importance of following these practices to prevent the spread of COVID. Visual cues will be used in areas such as rest rooms, cafeterias and classrooms.
d. <a href="#">Cleaning</a> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <a href="#">ventilation</a> ;	The District will continue to follow CDC guidelines for cleaning, disinfecting and sanitizing that the district has already established. Updated information will be monitored and implemented when feasible.
e. <a href="#">Contact tracing</a> in combination with <a href="#">isolation</a> and <a href="#">quarantine</a> , in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	Consistent with Title 28 Pa. Code Chapter 27, the East Lycoming School District will exclude any student or staff who are showing symptoms of COVID or who have tested positive for COVID. In addition, as required by Title 28, the district will complete contract tracing, notification of close contacts and provide the appropriate information to the PA-DOH. Effective December 15, 2021, asymptomatic students who were determined to be a close contact at school will not be excluded from school. If parents/guardians, upon notice of exposure, decide to exclude their child, absences for the dates of the quarantine will be legal/excused. Symptomatic students/staff and those that test positive regardless of symptoms, will be excluded from school.

	Those exposed at home to a positive case will be excluded from school.
f. <a href="#">Diagnostic</a> and screening testing;	The East Lycoming School District will continue to educate our students, parents and staff on the symptoms of COVID-19 that would require students and staff members to be out of school. The district will also maintain a list of facilities where a COVID test can be obtained.
g. Efforts to provide <a href="#">vaccinations to school communities</a> ;	Vaccinations of students and staff members will not be required. The district has already provided an opportunity for staff to be vaccinated. The district will maintain a list of where vaccinations can be obtained.
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	The district will continue to offer continuity of education for all students. Students will also be provided with FAPE, a free appropriate public education.
i. Coordination with state and local health officials.	The district has forged a positive working relationship with local state health officials during the 20-21 school year. The district will leverage this relationship as needed for the health and safety of our students.
